The EEF is growing!

This year our exciting new goal is to add a regional manager and a community liaison specialist in Chiri to increase our local capacity. At the last Board meeting, we approved this expansion because the need is great and adding additional students beyond our 40 requires a new structure. We are working with our Country Manager Zelalem to hire a parttime Regional Manager who will work with schools and government officials, oversee the scholar's committee (the local committee that selects qualified students), and identify opportunities for the EEF to support more students. The Community Liaison Specialist will work closely with the students to help them realize their potential and allow us to better understand their needs.



A CHALLENGE OVERCOME:

One of our students became pregnant in her final year in technical college in 2022. Although she was studying Digital Technology, she decided to take a night course in cosmetology as well. Shortly after her baby was born she graduated from college and was immediately able to get work in cosmetology while looking for a permanent IT job. The EEF gives all students a leaving gift for graduation, so she also received a significant sum of money to help her during this transition. Statistically we know that her child will be healthier and get a better education because her mother is educated.





SUCCESS:

Sometimes we have a student drop out or disappear after high school. Sometimes those students reappear! Simign is one who graduated high school and went back home. Last year she called our manager and asked if we would support her in nursing school. We were pleased to say yes and that we could support her with living expenses while she attends a private nursing college in a distant city. We will provide her with the same amount of funds that we give to nursing students in government schools. Stephanie was able to meet with Simgn in October 2022 and happy to report that Simgn is able to pursue her dream. We applaud the initiative of the EEF students and we are ready to support them when they are ready to go (back) to school.
